A clear guide to reading the DC Network live market screen: runner profiles, market moves, repeat signals, best odds, momentum warnings, live alerts and dashboard cards.

Main principle

The terminal is not just an odds board. It shows what the market is doing now, then compares that behaviour with each horse's historical Market Form profile.

What this guide is for

Use this PDF as a quick reference for new members. It explains what each label, number, badge and warning means, without assuming racing data knowledge.

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1. Live Market Pressure dashboard

This is the top summary area. It tells members what is happening across the whole day before they drill into individual runners.

Update time and LIVE status: confirms the data has refreshed and the terminal is active.

2

Top cards: fastest route to the day's standout themes - best backed, repeat signal, strong favourite and weak favourite.

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3

Ticker strip: scrolling headline-style market intelligence with the most urgent live message.

2. What each dashboard section means

Best Backed

Repeat Signal

Strong Fav / Weak Fav

Ticker strip

Runners Today / Shown After Filters

Active Signals / Live Alerts

Active Signals counts runners meeting signal rules.
Live Alerts counts the more readable alert messages generated for users.

How members should use this page

Start with the top cards and alerts to understand the day's market tone. Then scroll into runner rows for detail. The dashboard gives the overview; the runner rows explain the evidence.

Important note

A green alert does not mean an automatic bet. A red warning does not mean an automatic lay. The value comes from combining current price movement with historical Market Form context.

3. Runner row anatomy

Each runner row is read from left to right: identity, current market move, historical repeat context, best odds and momentum guidance.

1 Profile badge: high-level read of the horse's historical market behaviour.

2 Horse name plus historical runs, price range and average price.

3 Action label: WATCH, AVOID or similar guidance based on the market profile.

4 Price bar and open-to-now prices show the live move.

5 Main percentage move: size of today's market move.

6 Repeat pattern score: how often setups placed or won.

7 Bookmaker/best price area: where the current notable price is displayed.

8 Momentum projection and best-time guidance summarise when the price looked strongest.

4. Runner row features in plain English

Profile label

Runs / Range / Average

WATCH / AVOID

Open - Now

The opening price is where the horse started in the market. Now is the latest live price. A fall from open to now is support; a rise is drift.

Price path row

The small sequence of prices shows how the move developed. Repeated prices mean stability. Sudden jumps show the market changed quickly.

Abs move

Absolute move is the size of today's price movement. Bigger numbers mean a stronger market change, but context matters.

Repeat strike / record

This compares today's setup with previous similar setups for the horse. Example: 4/4 placed means all four similar historical setups placed.

Bookmaker and best price

This shows where the standout or current best price is being seen. It helps users know whether the price is broadly available or bookmaker-specific.

Momentum Projection

A plain-English projection of whether early money, late money or a drift profile suggests strength, weakness or possible recovery later.

5. Warning and drift examples

Red movement bars, AVOID labels and large negative moves are designed to stop users ignoring market weakness.

Red bar / DRIFT

A red bar means the horse has moved out in the market. In the Begin The Luck example, open 7.000 to now 15.000 is a major drift.

Ignores Market / Mixed Profile

These labels warn that the current market is not strongly aligned with the horse's positive historical behaviour, or that its history is inconsistent.

Best time: Now was biggest

This tells you the strongest point in the move. For drifters, it can mean the current drift is the biggest warning point of the day.

6. Repeat setup and repeat winner signal examples

These rows show how the terminal highlights horses backed in a way that resembles a previous positive setup.

Emerging Repeat Setup

This appears when today's movement is starting to resemble a previous positive pattern but may still be building. It is a watchlist-style signal.

Repeat Winner Signal

This is a stronger label. It means the horse has a historical repeat pattern that fits today's move more clearly.

100% repeat place strike

This does not mean certainty. It means that, in the qualifying historical sample, every comparable setup placed. Always check sample size.

8. Simple reading checklist

A member can use this order every time they open the terminal.

1. Check the dashboard

Look at Best Backed, Repeat Signal, Strong Fav and Weak Fav to understand the overall market picture.

3. Read the price move

Compare Open to Now. Green/support means shortening. Red/drift means weakness.

5. Check the bookmaker and best price

Use the bookmaker/best odds area to understand where the current price is available.

7. Do not overread one field

The best decisions come from combining current price, Market Form history, sample size and race context.

2. Read the left side of a runner row

Start with the profile label, horse name, historical runs, price range, average and WATCH/AVOID label.

4. Check the repeat evidence

Look at repeat strike, qualifying runs, placed/won record and sample size.

6. Finish with Momentum Projection

This gives the plain-English interpretation: strengthening, weakening, possible recovery, or no clear edge.

8. Use alerts as shortcuts

Live alerts are designed to save time. They point you to rows worth checking, not to replace judgement.

Final reminder: the terminal is a decision-support tool. It helps users see pressure, weakness, repeat patterns and timing. It should be used alongside normal form reading, price discipline and sensible staking.
